We have had a very busy week this week in nursery learning all about a boy called Jack and a beanstalk he climbed. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this traditional story and all the wonderful planting and growing they have been doing. They have learnt to remember the beginning, middle and end of the story, the characters and to know how we read in English from the top to the bottom of the page and from left to right.
